Northern Regeneration - Build Up

Northern Regeneration aims to turn opportunity into reality for local customers, students and partners through their innovative Construction Skills Village model. The model was handcrafted by industry for industry, with the simple aim of bringing education and industry closer together. Northern Regeneration have continued to work with and listen to industry partners, together they have further developed the Construction Skills Village to help address the growing skills gap. The team has grown and has extensive experience in supporting individuals into training in the construction industry.

The Build Up project is a non accredited pre construction training programme. It aims to raise the aspirations of the unemployed and potential NEETs looking for work in construction and related industries. The pre construction training programme helps individuals to identify a pathway to further learning, an apprenticeship or employment. The project offers participants a series of interventions and non accredited training, prior to moving them into accredited industry required training and qualifications.

"I've always wanted to work with my hands but didn't know what course I would like to do, I've tried a few - joinery, but I prefer bricklaying. I now look at buildings all the time - seeing something different every day, always on the lookout, seeing different bonds."

Advantage Coast

The Advantage Coast Community Led Local Development (CLLD) programme aims to:

- Support business and enterprise growth
- Increase employment by supporting creation of new jobs
- Help those furthest from the labour market improve their employment opportunities
- Help to improve the skills and experience of unemployed people

The programme is funded by a joint bid made by East Riding of Yorkshire Council and Scarborough Borough Council, which secured £6.9 million from the European Structural Investment Fund to support community development, business growth and enterprise along the Yorkshire Coast.

Social Value Engine
