Blue Dragonfly Resources - SPARKS

Blue Dragonfly Resources manage the SPARKS Project in Barrowcliff Scarborough, which offers hands on support for residents with all aspects of their lives including: money management, parenting, healthy eating and cooking, health and wellbeing, self esteem and confidence, to progress into training and employment.

SPARKS aims to:

- Cover gaps in current service provision to ensure no one “falls through the net”
- Work intensively with complex families, removing barriers to employment
- Work in partnership with existing provision to enhance it
- Work with families to help them feel confident and safe accessing statutory services
- Expose families to new activities outside of the estate to open minds and grow confidence

Advantage Coast

The Advantage Coast Community Led Local Development (CLLD) programme aims to:

- Support business and enterprise growth
- Increase employment by supporting creation of new jobs
- Help those furthest from the labour market improve their employment opportunities
- Help to improve the skills and experience of unemployed people

The programme is funded by a joint bid made by East Riding of Yorkshire Council and Scarborough Borough Council, which secured £6.9 million from the European Structural Investment Fund to support community development, business growth and enterprise along the Yorkshire Coast.

- 5 participants have improved mental health

Social Value Engine

The CLLD programme is using the Social Value Engine to help identify a monetary value to represent the estimated social return of the programme as a whole.
