Age UK Centre Improvement/Training Suite

Age UK Scarborough & District promotes the well-being of all older people and to help make later life more fulfilling and enjoyable. This project refurbished and expanded the building enabling it to become a Community Hub.

The refurbishment aimed to:

- Offer better access, making full use of the premises
- Three refurbished training and activity suites enabling engagement with a wider audience
- Offer a newly designed, bespoke employment training programme to those aged 50+
- Provision of a lift and levelling of floors will provide the means to fully accessible space
- New toilets with disabled access
- There will be full kitchen facilities along with a 'Training' kitchen area
- Volunteering opportunities increased, allowing for the development of new skills and improving self-worth and employability

The Advantage Coast Community Led Local Development (CLLD) programme aims to:

- Support business and enterprise growth
- Increase employment by supporting creation of new jobs
- Help those furthest from the labour market improve their employment opportunities
- Help to improve the skills and experience of unemployed people

The programme is funded by a joint bid made by East Riding of Yorkshire Council and Scarborough Borough Council, which secured £6.9 million from the European Structural Investment Fund to support community development, business growth and enterprise along the Yorkshire Coast.
