Future Works North Yorkshire – Future Works

This project helped deliver new skills and qualifications to disengaged young people that enabled them to move closer to new opportunities such as employment or further learning.

Working with disenfranchised young people within the local area, this project gave young people the opportunity to focus on qualifications they once thought unachievable. Each young person worked towards Functional Maths and / or English in line with their own abilities and requirements. This increased not only their knowledge but also their confidence in using Maths and English skills within their personal life as well as future employment prospects.

Participants also worked on a City & Guilds Employability qualification, further enhancing skills and knowledge of career planning, applying for and sustaining employment. This qualification was tailored to personal interests and career plans as well as producing a portfolio according to their own abilities. This qualification enabled young people to practice their job searching skills whilst achieving a qualification and applying for actual jobs with the support of an experienced member of staff.

The Advantage Coast Community Led Local Development (CLLD) programme aims to:

- Support business and enterprise growth
- Increase employment by supporting creation of new jobs
- Help those furthest from the labour market improve their employment opportunities
- Help to improve the skills and experience of unemployed people

The programme is funded by a joint bid made by East Riding of Yorkshire Council and Scarborough Borough Council, which secured £6.9 million from the European Structural Investment Fund to support community development, business growth and enterprise along the Yorkshire Coast.

Active, inclusive and safe

- 43 participants reported feeling more motivated
- 11 participants reported feeling more confident

- 22 completed qualifications
- 8 participants gained employment
- 64 participants improved life skills

- 44 participants have improved physical health
- 5 participants have improved mental health

Social Value Engine

The CLLD programme is using the Social Value Engine to help identify a monetary value to represent the estimated social return of the programme as a whole. To build this picture we have used the Social Value Engine to calculate the social return of each CLLD project. We looked at the number of people and/or organisations each project has worked with to understand how many stakeholders have been impacted.
