



Project Impact Report 2022-2023





Yorkshire in Business is a well-established Enterprise Agency set up in 1985. Our vision is to raise skills and aspirations in the communities in which we operate. We aim to achieve this by focusing on enterprise in order to assist personal economic independence and a powerful entrepreneurial culture. Gateway to Care is a programme created in reaction to the impact that Covid19 and current national recruitment challenges.

The East Riding of Yorkshire County has a huge demand for domiciliary care workers and there is currently not enough workers to fill the demand. This project was a pilot to look at how we can inspire individuals to strive to fulfil these demands by offering a range of mentoring, training, job matching and selfemployment options in care roles.

Many individuals are not ready to adapt to the changes that we now find ourselves having to overcome alongside new habits and ways of living as a result of covid 19 pandemic and now faced with the increase cost of living alongside other financial challenges and so we offered a tailored support service on a oneto-one basis by our life coach's that assisted participants to realise and reach their full potential.

This project included activities such as a mapping exercise of current care vacancies vs care provision and support, alongside awareness building activities and linking skills/people with local jobs, psychological employability, nurturing participants, facilitating access to training and developing enterprising ideas.

- Support business and enterprise growth
- Increase employment by supporting creation of new jobs
- Help those furthest from the labour market improve their employment opportunities
- Help to improve the skills and experience of unemployed people

The programme is funded by a joint bid made by East Riding of Yorkshire Council and Scarborough Borough Council, which secured £6.9 million from the European Structural Investment Fund to support community development, business growth and enterprise along the Yorkshire Coast.
